Carbon Monoxide Concern

This structure has propane/gas appliances and/or heaters/furnaces on the location. Restoration equipment has a potential to create negative pressure zones within the drying environment. These negative pressure zones have been known to cause a backdraft of exhaust and reverse the carbon monoxide from the gas appliances, back into the living space.

The contractor is installing carbon monoxide sensors on all floors to ensure that the insured has adequate warning if a backdraft occurs. In the event you hear the carbon monoxide sensor activate, immediately evacuate the structure and contact the restorer.

Breathing in high levels of carbon monoxide can lead to carbon monoxide poisoning. If you are experiencing "flu-like" symptoms that can include headache, dizziness, weakness, vomiting, chest pain, and confusion call 911 immediately after leaving the structure.
